

Page 8 under the “youth” section states: Not less than 95% of all enrollees must be economically disadvantaged. Is this for both OSY and ISY or only ISY participants? [See SOP 17-05 on local website.](#)

Are all the 14 elements provided to ISY through JAG or will we be providing services collaboratively. [The 14 elements provided to ISY are usually provided through JAG.](#) Are ISY services currently provided at host schools or in “center” locations? [At host schools.](#)

Will we be required to identify specific schools to offer programming or are the schools already identified? [Schools are already identified.](#)

As far as OSY are we to use the JAG model as the framework for our programming or are there JAG programs specific to OSY that we should be collaborating with? [OSY might use some of the JAG competencies and format to provide one or more of the 14 elements. Format could be individual instead of class.
